Recognition honors co-op's participation in nationwide get-out-the-vote effort

Duck River Electric Membership Corporation has been named a "5-Star Co-op" by the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA). The 5-star designation recognizes DREMC's high level of participation in *Co-ops Vote*, a national get-out-the-vote campaign. The campaign is a non-partisan effort that seeks to boost voter turnout in areas served by electric co-ops all across the country.

"Electric cooperatives play a unique and special role as a voice in their communities," said DREMC President and CEO Michael Watson. "That level of strong engagement is evident in the conversation DREMC has created around the opportunity to vote. Elections are important, especially in rural areas, and DREMC has used the *Co-ops Vote* program to increase awareness of our civic duty on every Election Day. Five-star status marks the highest level of engagement in *Co-ops Vote* and is achieved when a participating electric co-op completes at least five activities under the program.

The *Co-ops Vote* campaign was launched by America's electric co-ops in response to continued voter apathy, particularly in rural America. According to officials, rural voter turnout dropped 18 percent in the 2012 presidential election. Since the *Co-ops Vote* launched its initiative, more than 560 electric co-ops have joined forces through *Co-ops Vote* to increase voter turnout in areas served by co-ops, which include much of rural America.
