Keeping DREMC crews safe by slowing down, moving over

The hazards of linework extend beyond working around live electric lines every day. Line workers across the country battle dangerous weather conditions, unforgiving temperatures and densely wooded areas, which compounds the hazards of the job.

Among one of the most dangerous aspects of their environment is the presence of motor vehicles near job sites.

When line crews pull over on the side of the road to assess damage or stage their job site, there is always the risk that other motorists will not give

them the space needed to safely perform their work.

The state of Tennessee passed the Move Over Law in 2006 to enforce the need for motorists to give extra room to first responders. Thankfully, this was expanded to line workers in 2011.

It is my hope that Duck River Electric never again experiences a team member injured by a motor vehicle while serving their community. That is why this law and the support of our local communities are so important.

While we see many people go out of their way to move over in observance of crews, there were 154 violations issued in communities served by DREMC in 2021 according to the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security. We appreciate every effort that can be made to keep our line crews safe.

Crews utilize cones, flashing vehicle lights and other hazard mitigation tools to notify drivers of their presence. However, bad weather, distracted driving and speeding can lead

to disaster, despite these efforts.

When changing lanes is not possible, reducing vehicle speed around these stopped vehicles is the next best solution.

Regardless of the dangers involved,

DREMC crews are dedicated to ensuring that the membership receives safe and reliable power at the lowest possible cost.

This can come at a tremendous personal expense if we do not work together to ensure their safety.

Thank you for joining us in doing our part to slow down and move over for first responders, including our local line workers.





Duck River Electric's PowerUP Prepay program offers members an option for traditional monthly due dates and payments.

PowerUp Prepay works similar to a prepaid debit card, allowing you to add funds to your account as you go rather than paying a lump sum once a month.

This pay-as-you-go option helps members keep track of their daily electric use so they can make wise decisions on how to manage it, which puts the power to save in the members' hands.

Daily texts and email messages can be sent to update you on the balance of your prepay account so that you stay current.

How does raising the HVAC thermostat setting in the summer help lower the electric bill?

Raising the temperature setting for the HVAC unit or air conditioner narrows the temperature difference between outdoor and indoor temperatures, which means the unit doesn't have to work as hard to meet the cooling demand.



Can cooking with the microwave help you save energy?

On average, cooking only makes up for 2% of the average household's electric bill, but using the microwave as opposed to the oven or stove can still cut out a large percentage of that cost. Microwaves are quicker, use less energy and are useful in the summer because they don't contribute extra heat to the kitchen, forcing your air conditioner to work harder to keep the house cooled.



Do energy-efficient appliances really save you money?

In many cases, newer, more energy-efficient appliances can save energy, which can lead to lower energy bills. Before purchasing a new appliance, visit TVA's EnergyRight Marketplace to compare efficiency ratings of available options. Also, look for the Energy Star label when purchasing a new appliance. The label includes the estimated yearly operating cost of the appliance.



Does using a computer screensaver save energy?

While a screensaver may seem similar to the sleep mode on the computer, it's actually a separate program that uses energy constantly while it runs. It is recommended to let the computer go into the sleep mode or turn the monitor off, if it's a desktop. Also, leaving a computer on overnight uses a substantial amount of energy - even in sleep mode.

Does closing the vents to unused rooms save energy?

You might think closing vents in unused rooms makes sense and will save energy because your system has to heat or cool less space. However, closing vents increases the air pressure in your system, which makes the unit work harder and use more energy.
